### 2. Community Priorities

#### a. Vehicle Crime Reduction – A165 Area

Throughout July 2018 Theft from motor vehicles (TFMV) saw a further decrease to 6 reports along with two thefts of vehicles, the majority of these crimes occurred along the south A165 corridor from Bilton to Long Riston. Throughout August, staff from the Holderness Community Police Team will continue to provide high visibility reassurance patrols to deter theft from vehicles. Crime prevention packs will be give out to drivers.

#### b. Burglary reports

July 2018 saw an increase of burglary to nine reports. There was one residential burglary via an insecure rear door, two in properties under renovation and five reports of sheds/farm outbuildings broken into for gardening equipment.

#### c. ASB Patrol – Bilton Village Hall

Since the Community Officer has had a base station at the village hall and increased presence, there were no reports of damage nor anti-social behaviour from groups of youths gathering at the village hall during July 2018. Community Police Team will continue to visit the location during the summer to prevent incidents and disperse any groups that could possibly be involved in such activities.

## Vehicle crime

Most vehicle crime is preventable. It can take as little as 10 seconds for a thief to steal something from your car. The best way to protect your belongings is to lock your car whenever you leave it. For keyless vehicles – ALWAYS CHECK THE FOB HAS DONE ITS JOB!

Other things you can do include:

- Removing everything from the car; don't even leave a jacket where it can be seen
- Closing the sunroof along with the windows when you leave
- Not storing things in the boot; take them with you
- Storing car ownership information in your home, not your car
- Having a routine to ensure you always take the keys out of the ignition
- Taking removable stereos and sat nav equipment with you
- Leave the empty glove-box open
- In addition, using secure (theft resistant) number plates can make your plates less attractive to thieves

Where you park can make a big difference to the safety of your car and your belongings.
