### 2. Community Priorities

- a. <u>Vehicle Crimes</u> 7 reports across October 2018, three of these were motorcycles/moped taken from gardens. Theft from motor vehicles dropped in four reports. Please remove all valuables from vehicle when left unattended and leave the glove-box open and empty to reduce the opportunity of becoming a victim.
- b. <u>Burglary reports</u> 8 reports across October 2018, two of these were residential burglaries, offenders had gained entry via the rear patio doors in Swine and Arnold, made untidy search of the properties and stole jewellery, ipad and monies. One attempt was made to gain entry to a village store in Skirlaugh and a total of three garages attacked in Sproatley, the other two were in a farm outbuilding in Thirtleby and Skirlaugh.
- c. <u>Thefts</u> 7 reports across October, two of these involved batteries been stolen from temporary traffic lights in the Burstwick and New Ellerby area. A Refrigerated Trailer Unit was stolen in Burstwick. One make off without payment of fuel in Bilton; a mobile welder taken from a farmyard in Catwick; youths removed roof tiles and outside lighting bulbs in Bilton and there was a cycle stolen from a Pub beer garden in Burton Pidsea
- d.  $\underline{\text{Damage -}}$  a vehicle and a dwelling, owned by the same victim, had graffiti paint sprayed onto them during the night of 13/10/18
- e. <u>Community Road Watch</u> Members of Withernwick Neighbourhood Watch group have had to opportunity to join Neighbourhood Police Officer to monitor the speed of traffic through their village; this task was a good deterrent as only a small number of vehicles were recorded over the 30mph limit.
- f. Operation Topaz this is the Force response to policing of the events between 19<sup>th</sup> October to 6<sup>th</sup> November and centres around the school holiday and reducing acts of anti-social behaviour around the Halloween and Bonfire fire nights. Visits by the Community Police teams have taken place within schools and shops to raise awareness. Specific

patrols will be conducted in locations which have historically been subject to levels of anti-social behaviour and crimes.

#### 3. Crime Reduction Advice

With the arrival of the longer winter nights, take a fresh look at your home security and remind yourself of how to stay as safe as possible when out, about or at home

- Keep front and back doors locked at all times and keep keys and valuables out of sight and reach from cat flaps, letterboxes, and downstairs doors and windows
- If you're out in the evening make sure you leave a light on and draw the curtains. If it's dark before you get home, use timer switches to turn on energy-saving lights
- Light up your front door with dusk to dawn lighting make sure it's visible from the street
- Make sure your home is visible from the street by keeping bushes and fences less than one metre high at the front of your property
- Don't forget about garages, sheds and outbuildings make sure they're locked and secure too
- Try not to leave your house in silent darkness. Just leaving a radio on could make a potential burglar think twice
- Never leave a spare key outside your house, burglars know all the usual hiding spots
- Keep bins away from windows when they're not being used as they can be used as a climbing aid for burglars
- Consider joining or setting up a Neighbourhood Watch scheme.
