1	Apologies for absence
	Apologies were received from BJH and PT.
2	Minutes of the previous meeting (23 April 2015)
	The minutes of the previous meeting were reviewed and agreed.
3	Matters arising
	JW had arranged for members of the CLG to visit the site prior to the meeting and have a look at the planting on the bunding surrounding the site. Three members of the CLG attended. These members commented that the planting was “much improved”. The vast majority of the planning was doing very well with most of the trees greater than 12 foot. The northern bund, which was heightened last year as part of the stores building works, has got trees growing well on it, and will continue to provide increased screening as they continue to grow over the next couple of years.
4	Aldbrough Operations
	MGi updated that site operations continue as normal. The site outage was successfully completed, and the 24 hour working has also now stopped. MGi distributed the noise table, some breaches had

	occurred, but some were when the site was on outage and so highly unlikely to be related to the site.

outflow and drainage, but is still awaiting a response. JW to ensure that this is available for the next CLG meeting

- The walk of the bund took place this evening. MR said that he was surprised at how much improvement had been made since his last visit around 16 months ago and BJH said that the trees looked healthy and some of the willows at around 10 foot tall.

**Walk of the bund Information**

MR and BJH joined MGI and JW on a walk of the bund, prior to the CLG meeting. Ted from Heritage Hedging, the contractor that has been asked to improve the vegetation on the bund, gave some information on the issues that bund faces and the improvements that are being made. He said that the biggest threat to the health of the trees was the grass around them as this was taking the valuable nutrients and water, which is why the grass has been sprayed with weed killer. The trees have then been fertilised and mulched, which helps to raise the soil temperature. The large willows are now acting as a wind break for the other trees, which is protecting them. Ted estimated that within the next couple of years, much further improvement will be seen in the health and height of the trees. Some pictures of the Northern bund are below. MGI explained that the Western bund will be raised by two metres during the upcoming Stores Building works and vegetation will then be planted on top of that, providing much greater screening from the site.



**4 Phase 1 Update**

MGI followed up on MR and BJH's points that the walk of the bund had taken place. Most of the willows are around 10 foot high, and the pines are doing well with around 6-8 inches of growth this year. He acknowledged that there is still work to be done, but this is ongoing, and that real
